Getting to know each other, group formation - the programme as a network. Motivation and goals of participation in the programme. Assessment of the current situation. Personal strengths and areas of development. Life and career planning. What does career mean? Basics of self-organization and time management. Burnout prevention. Goals: Using personal strengths in the professional setting. Identifying personal development areas and initiating change processes. Planning your career, identifying and pursuing professional and private goals.

Self-presentation strategies in academia. Lecture and presentation techniques. Speaking up effectively and to the point. Media coverage. Goals: presenting yourself effectively and self-confident within your scientific community.

"Doing and Undoing Gender" and equal opportunities at university, part 1

Basics of various feminist discourses and the history of women's movements, their aims and political means; introduction to the history of women* in academia. Goals & Method: Through interactive inputs from the instructor and related reflection and exchange in groups, participants will gain more knowledge and awareness of feminist discourses and current approaches to gender equality policies.

Negotiation skills and management. Harvard Concept. When to negotiate? What to negotiate? Win/win strategies. Negotiation strategies for subordinates. Goals: dealing proactively with tricky negotiations. Instructor: Mag. Ute Riedler

6. Seminar, Friday 16. July 2021

"Doing and Undoing Gender" and equal opportunities at university, part 2

Presentation and discussion of research findings on different gender biases in science and phenomena such as "leaky pipeline", "women \neq science", gender publication bias, how and where different evaluations of researchers take place (e.g. letters of recommendation, recruitment decisions, etc.). Building on this, current gender equality measures and methods (e.g. promotion of women, gender equality plans, working group for equal opportunities, etc.) are presented and reflected upon. Goals & methods: by the means of research-based inputs by the instructor, subsequent exercises and reflections, the imparted knowledge will be integrated into the participants' own life realities, thus raising awareness, building gender competence and accomplishing empowerment.

Organization and organizational culture at university.

Structure and process management of a university, steering instruments, dealing with areas of tension and contradictions. Opportunities to influence structures, culture and power relations at universities. Goals: getting to know different university structures and the field of university management. Critical reflection of organizational culture and developing personal strategies.

Status-quo at university regarding options of participation for female scientists. Reflection of the entire programme. Goals: confident leadership as a female scientist. Knowing opportunities to participate in management decisions within university. Group networking.
