In feminist research, it is standard practice to investigate experience-related knowledge in order to represent the lived realities of women. However, it is revealed that such knowledge can only be gathered using an intersectional perspective which allows for making visible diverse attributions of differences and social inequality. Against this backdrop, this workshop on methodologies of Aging and Care Research opens up a space for junior researchers (Pre-Doc and Post-Doc) getting to know each other to have in-depth discussions on their research.

The first day of the workshop focuses on research projects in the field of Age(ing), Care, and Migration Studies which will be presented from a methodological viewpoint. Day two is dedicated to Narrative Inquiry as a practical research method.

In the evening of day one, the talks by Prof. Mark Schweda (University of Oldenburg, Germany) and Prof. Vera Caine (University of Victoria, Canada) will be open to public audiences.
