The University of Graz invites applications for up to 1 position for Doctoral Researchers (30 hrs per week) for PhD projects in the fields of Archaeology (Cypriot, Aegean, or Near Eastern archaeology) within the framework of the International Graduate School (IGS) "Resonant Self-World Relations in Ancient and Modern Socio-Religious Practices" (supervisor Univ.-Prof. Dr. Laerke Recht). The International Graduate School is directed by Univ.-Prof. Dr. Wolfgang Spickermann and Univ.-Prof. Dr. Ursula Gärtner (Graz) and Prof. Dr. Jörg Rüpke and Prof. Dr. Hartmut Rosa (Erfurt). The position is to be filled by 1 October 2023 for a period of 24 months with the option of extension for a further 12 months pending review. The project is a cooperation between the Max-Weber-Kolleg at the University of Erfurt and the University of Graz, funded by the FWF and the DFG. Participants are required to spend one academic year at the cooperating university in the second year of their term. As an International Research Training Group, the programme's primary language is English. Core research fields and project suggestions in the framework of the IGS are outlined on the programme's website: <https://dk-resonance.uni-graz.at> (cf. "Suggested projects"). Further proposals developed by applicants for research projects that fit into the framework of "Resonant Self-World Relations" in the above named discipline are welcome. Your application must include the following: CV; outline of the Ph.D. project you would like to pursue (max. 5 pages) with a stringent discussion of your research questions, the state of research on the topic, the methodological approach and the leading hypotheses as well as a working schedule and projected date of completion; copies of your final school and university degrees, one letter of recommendation; and a copy of your MA or diploma thesis. You should also indicate in your letter of motivation who among the members of the faculty in Erfurt you see as your prospective supervisor. Prospective candidates will be invited to interviews conducted on 14 June 2023 in person or via video conferencing. Inquiries may be made to Dr. Anna-Katharina Rieger (resonance@uni-graz.at).

- Completion of a dissertation in the field of Cypriot, Aegean or Near Eastern Archaeology
- Independent research within the frame of the IGS 'Resonant Self-World Relations' to be documented in publications and conference attendances
- Weekly participation in the colloquium of the IGS with one presentation per semester and feedback for the other

participants in the colloquium

- Regular attendance in seminars, reading groups and extracurricular activities of the IGS
- Organisation and/or participation in conferences of the IGS
- Research stay (12 months) at the University of Erfurt during the second year of the employment
