Ms Alison Hughes has been a member of staff at the University of Liverpool since 1997 working within the Continuing Professional Development Unit and latterly Continuing Education & Professional Development, Centre for Lifelong Learning. Her developmental work has focused on part time adult education, through supporting and organising a range of part-time adult learning activities across the

She has been working as a leading member of various university working groups on issues such as:

Accreditation of Prior Learning and Quality Assurance in University Lifelong Learning. Her recent work at European Level has included co-ordination of a LLP Grundtvig-funded networking project with trade unions and participation in a similar project with the voluntary sector.
