Lyn Tett is Professor of Community Education at the University of Huddersfield, UK; Emeritus Professor of Community Education and Lifelong Learning in the Moray House School of Education at the University of Edinburgh, UK and visiting Professor of Lifelong Learning at the University of Strathclyde, UK. Her research interests lie within the broad area of

community education and lifelong learning and has involved an investigation of the factors such as class, gender, disability that lead to the exclusion of adults from post-compulsory education and of the action that might be taken to promote social inclusion.

## Her most recent books are:

Community Education, Learning and Development (2010), Dunedin Academic Press and Adult Literacy, Numeracy and Language: Policy, Practice and Research (2006), Open University Press, edited with Mary Hamilton and Yvonne Hillier. She is currently editing More Powerful Literacies (together with Jim Crowther and Mary Hamilton) due to be published by the National Institute of Adult and Continuing Education (NIACE) in Autumn 2012.
