She has long been interested in ageing issues especially in aspects of later life learning and has published extensively in the field. Her most recent book is ***Improving Learning in Later Life (2010)*** published by Routledge which won a Book Award from the Society for Educational Studies and she contributed a chapter to the ***Routledge International Handbook of Learning (2012)***. She is a past Chair of the Association for Education and Ageing and is currently Chair of the Education and Research Committee of the Institute for Ageing and Health-West Midlands and a member of the executive of the Educational Centres Association, all based in the UK.
