"My Degree Programme NEW"

The application "My Degree Programme NEW" is the central application for students in UNIGRA-Zonline to give you an overview of your studies and to keep you informed about the progress of your degree programme. It is intuitive to use and accompanies you through your entire degree programme. There are different views to help you plan future activities. It is also the starting point for a range of actions that you carry out as part of your studies (including course and exam registration). "My Degree Programme" has a responsive design and can therefore also be used on **mobile devices**.

You can view your personal study progress in the application at any time:

- which examinations (technical term: nodes) you have already passed or which examinations are still open
- which courses or examinations you are already registered for
- whether you have already successfully completed the requirements defined in the curriculum for registering for courses and examinations
- view the current STEOP status

In order for UNIGRAZonline to be able to calculate your study progress or your completed registration requirements, your positive and already released achievements (examinations, recognitions) must be correctly assigned to the examination nodes of your curriculum. This is how the programme recognises how you (would like to) use your completed examinations and credits in your studies.

In your own interest, please check the assignment of your achievements regularly when you have new examination results in UNIGRAZonline! If the credits are not fully allocated, it is possible, for example, that you do not fulfil the registration requirements in the registration phases and your registration will be rejected by the system.

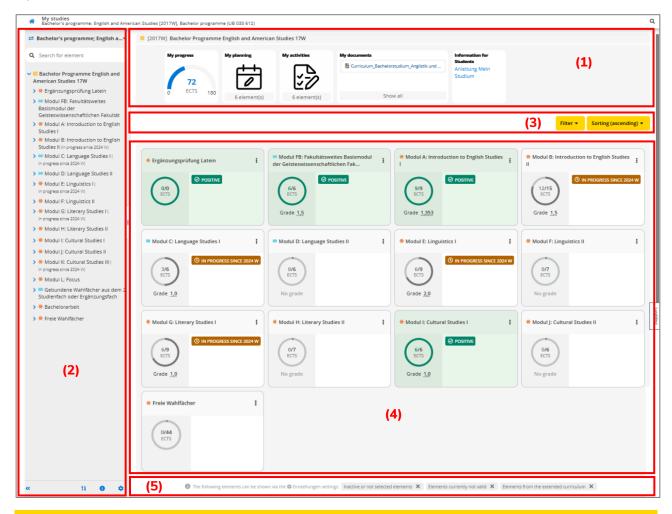

Dashboard of "My Degree Programme"

Log in to UNIGRAZonline and open the "My Degree Programme NEW" application and select your degree programme.



The "My Degree Programme" application is divided into a total of five areas, whereby a distinction can be made between the four elements of the main menu and the sidebar area. The contents of the main menu change to some extent depending on the level you are at in the application, but the visual layout remains the same.



Note: The term "Element" is used in the instructions. Element = Node

(1) "My study progress" area

Indicates the study programme you have just selected or accessed in "My Degree Programme". This gives you an overview of the selected degree programme. The various Widgets are displayed in this area. These are explained in detail in the chapter 1

(2) "Navigation" area

In this area, you can navigate through the study programme (displayed in a tree structure). The currently selected element is highlighted in bold. You also have the option of hiding the sidebar.

You can use the Switch Button to **switch between** your (active and closed) **studies**. The app also always "remembers" the last study you selected for the next time you use "My Degree Programme".

You can use the search function to search for specific elements in the selected degree programme.

You will find additional setting options in the lower area:

- Sorting Button: Sorting the elements
- Info Icon: Legend for the elements is displayed
- Gear Icon: Certain elements can be shown/hidden

(3) "Filter and sorting options" area

Here you can sort and filter the elements that are displayed in the detailed view. The available options adapt to the currently open level.

(4) "Detailed view" area

The elements of the curriculum (modules, examination nodes, etc.) are displayed here. Click on a tile to open the underlying level of the study structure of the selected curriculum, for example modules, courses or examinations.

(5) "Display settings" area

Filters available for displaying the study structure are shown in the footer. The various display options can be shown/hidden using the gear icon.

My study progress

The "My study progress" section provides you with an overview of your studies. Four widgets are displayed here by default, which are now described in detail.

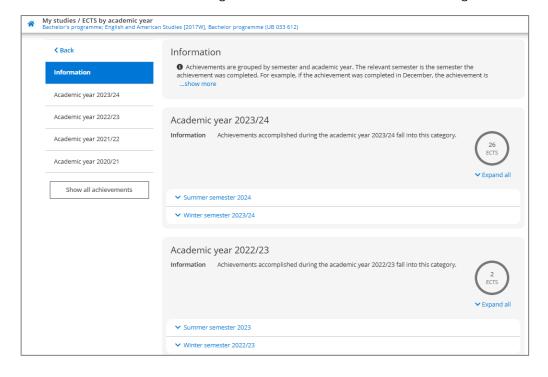


1. My progress

The total ECTS already achieved are displayed on the main page under "My progress".

If you click on the "My progress" widget, you will receive detailed information on the achievements you have already successfully completed. Here you can see how many ECTS (latest valid achievement) you have earned in a particular semester or academic year.

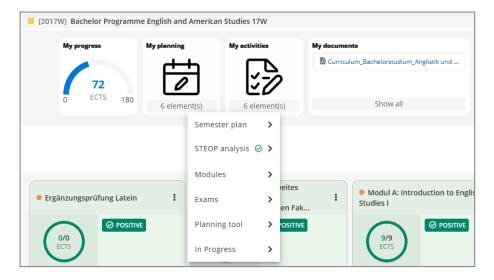
The ECTS credits achieved are totalled in each section. When calculating the credits, all achievements are taken into account, including the allocated free electives and recognitions.

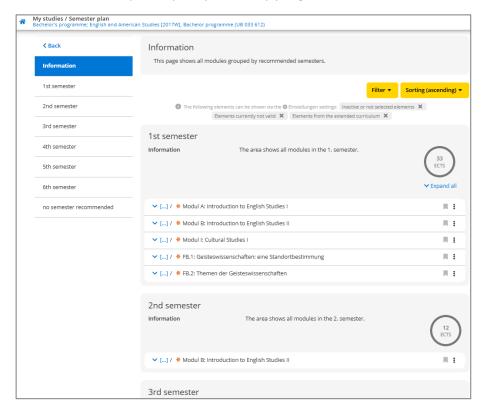
2. My planning

The "My planning" widget offers you various planning views. Here you can get an overview of your progress in the areas of modules and examinations as well as information on outstanding achievements.



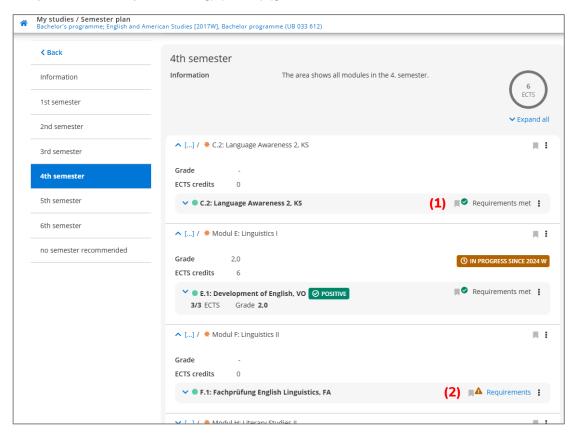
2.1. Semester plan

On this page, all modules of the selected degree programme are displayed grouped by semester to make it easier for you to plan your study progress.

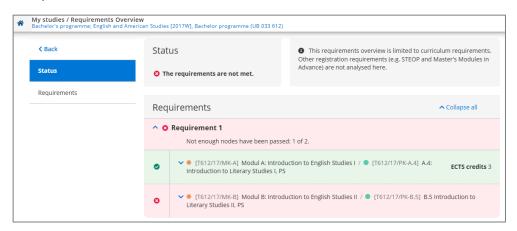

If you click on the icon next to a module, you will be shown further details. For example, you can see which examinations you have already passed and for which courses or examinations you fulfil or do not yet fulfil the requirements [(1) and (2)].



The link "Requirements" (2) takes you to the page "Requirements Overview". There you can see which requirements you are still missing for the respective course or examination and which you have already fulfilled.

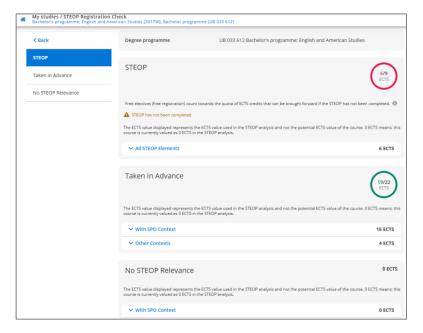

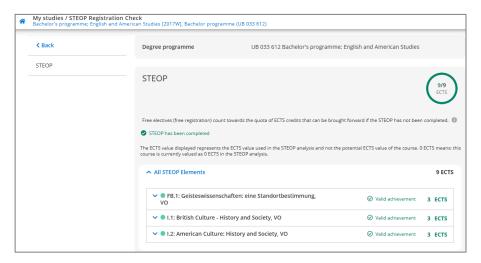
2.2. STEOP analysis

2.3. Modules

This page displays all open modules (not yet started), completed modules and modules in progress. This gives you an overview of the courses you still need to complete in order to successfully complete your degree programme.

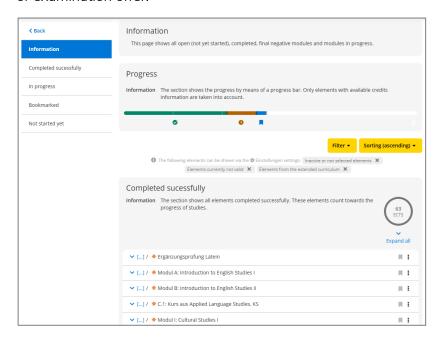

The **progress bar** provides you with a graphical representation of your progress:

- Green Tick Icon: All positively completed elements
- Orange Clock Icon: All items that are in progress
- Blue Bookmark Icon: All elements that have been bookmarked for planning (see also chapter 2.5)

Note: Please note that the categories "In progress" and "Completed successfully" are only displayed as soon as registrations or results are available.

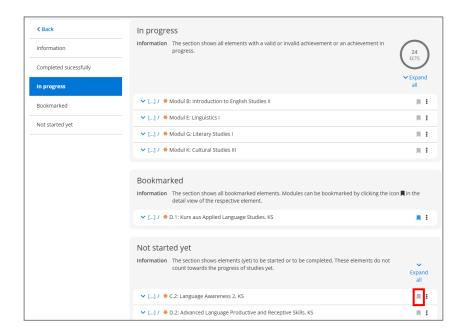
You can expand the individual elements in the respective sections to view the corresponding course or examination offer.



There are two ways to add an element of the programme structure to the "Bookmarked" area:

- 1. Click directly in the planning overview on the bookmark symbol on the right in the line of the corresponding element. The planning view is updated. If necessary, use the "Reload" function of your browser.
- 2. Navigate to the desired element via the tile menu of the "My Degree Programme" application and click on the bookmark symbol in the dashboard of the element. When you open the planning view, you will now find the element in the corresponding section.

2.4. Fxams

This page displays all open (not yet started), completed examinations and examinations in progress. This gives you an overview of the courses and examinations that you still have to complete in order to successfully finish your degree programme.

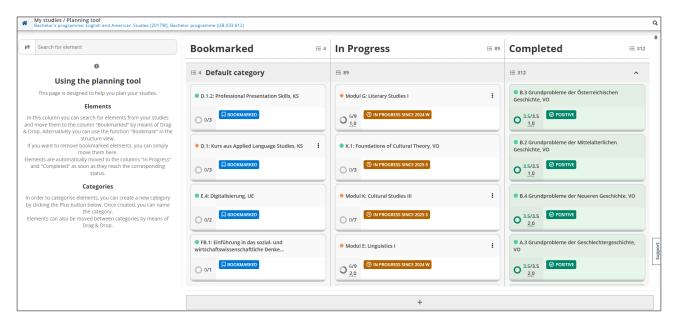
There is also a progress bar in this area, which provides you with a graphical representation of your progress (see also the chapter 2.3 Modules).

2.5. Planning tool

On this page, all elements of one or more studies are displayed in their respective progress status. You have the option of searching for elements, marking them, arranging them individually and categorising them into groups. The columns "Bookmarked", "In Progress" and "Completed" are displayed by default and the elements are automatically assigned to these categories. If an exam that was in progress has been successfully completed, it is automatically moved to the "Completed" category.

If you have enrolled in several studies, the elements of the different studies are colour-coded (same colour = same study).

Elements can be moved vertically as required, even across groups, in order to adjust the order of the elements. However, changes to the order within the three predefined groups are not saved. Only adjustments in the individual groups are saved. Elements can only be moved horizontally between the "Search" and "Bookmarked" columns.

You can also create your own categories by clicking on the + lcon.

The assignment of the elements to the columns and groups as well as the names of the groups are saved across all devices. In the mobile view, the page can only be displayed; it is not possible to move or search for elements here.

2.6. In progress

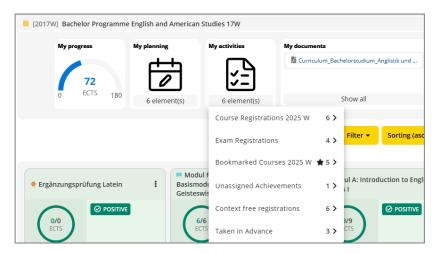
This page lists all elements (work in progress) that are in progress, grouped by semester. You will also find exam registrations here.

3. My activities

The widget shows your study activities and offers you various options. The number next to the links indicates the number of elements in the respective view.



- **Course Registrations (current semester)**: Link to the app "My Courses"

 The number shows the number of registrations for courses, regardless of whether the registration was for a fixed place or on the waiting list.
- **Exam Registrations**: Link to the app "Exam Registration Exam Dates"
- Bookmarked Courses (current semester): Link to the app "My bookmarked courses"
- **Unassigned Achievements** (if available): This takes you to a list in which you can allocate the achievements. Further information can be found in the chapter 12.
- **Context free registrations** (if available): This takes you to a list of elements that have the curriculum context "Free registration".
- **Taken in Advance** (if available): This takes you to a list of elements that have the curriculum context "Master subject in advance".

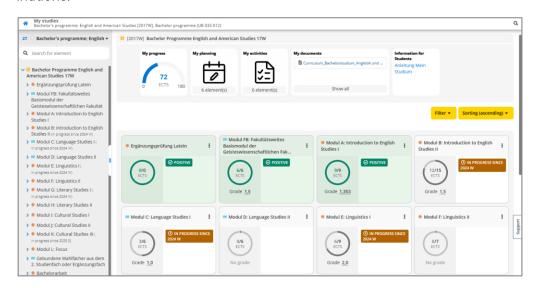
Here you will find the curriculum of your degree programme and any other relevant documents and information (e.g., links to websites).

Detailed view

5. Tile menu

The tile navigation in "My Degree Programme" follows a hierarchical principle. Each click on a tile in the main menu takes you one level deeper in the study structure until you reach the courses or examinations.



Various information is displayed in the individual tiles.

5.1. ECTS circle

The circular display shows how many ECTS credits have already been achieved (ACTUAL) and how many must be achieved in total for the element (TARGET).

- Grey circle: Not all ECTS credits for this element have been completed yet.
- Green circle: The element has been successfully completed.
- Red circle: The element has been completed negatively.
- "-": No ECTS credits have been defined.

5.2. Grade

The average grades are calculated and displayed for (almost) all elements. Please consider the grades given as <u>provisional</u> results only, as they may change when the final degree certificate is issued.

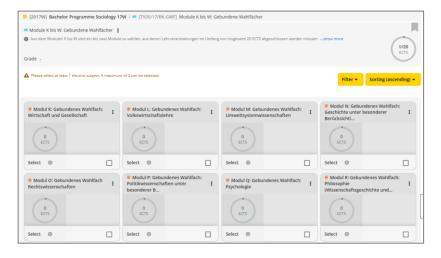
5.3. Tags

Various additional information (tags) is displayed for each element.

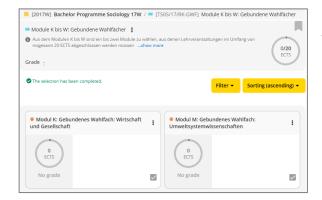
- Positive / Negative
- STEOP / Can be completed without STEOP
- Temporal validity (Invalid since xxx, Valid from xxx) (see also chapter 10)
- Inactive (due to selection procedure) (see also chapter 10)
- Not part of the curriculum (expanded curriculum; these are elements that are not part of the degree programme but fulfil an important purpose for the administration, for example). (see also chapter 10)
- In progress since xxx
- Bookmarked (for planning)

5.4. Selection checkbox

The checkbox is displayed for elements for which a selection rule is stored. An information text indicates how many elements must be selected and by whom the selection may be made (students and/or administrators).

If, for example, two elements have to be selected and these have been selected by the student, the elements that have not been selected are inactive, greyed out and no longer displayed.

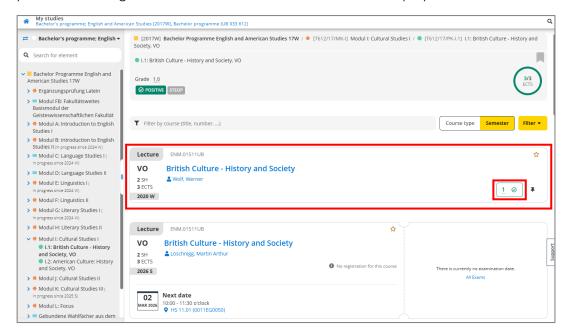
6. Courses and examinations

The courses and examinations of the current or future semester are displayed at the examination node level.

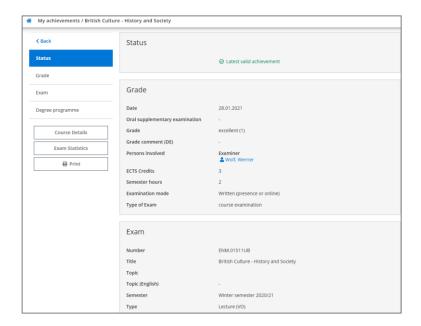
You can use the "Show all courses" link to show or hide other past courses.

6.1. Positively completed achievements

Achievements that have already been successfully completed are displayed at the top of the list. If you click on the grade, the details of the achievement are displayed.

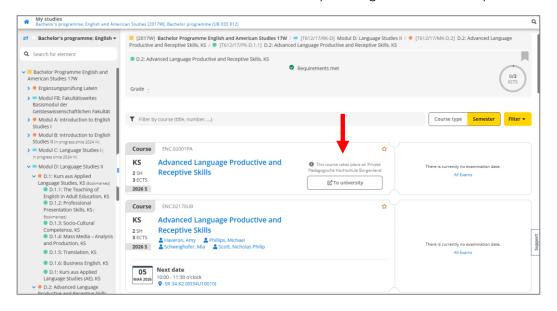

6.2. Courses offered by other educational institutions

If a course is offered by another educational institution, you can switch to the detailed description of the course at the other educational institution by clicking on "To university".

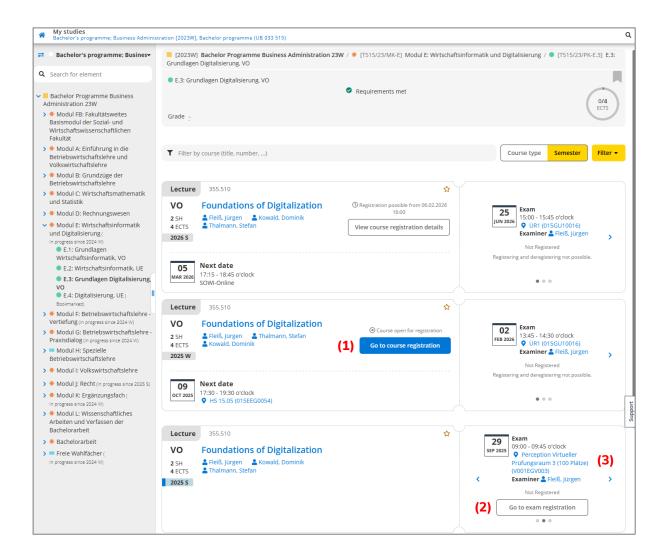


6.3. Course and examination registration

If it is possible to register for a course or examination, this is indicated by a note. By clicking on "Go to course registration" (1), you will be redirected to the "Courses" application. Clicking on "Go to exam registration" (2) takes you to the "Exam Registration – Exam Dates" application.

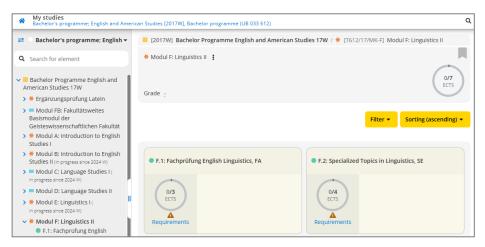
If several examination dates are available, you can navigate between them using the arrow buttons (</>) (3).

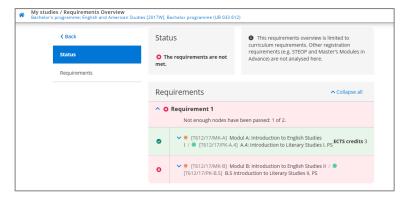
6.4. Requirements

If there are **requirements** for registering for courses and examinations in the curriculum, the note "Requirements" is displayed next to the respective tile and the tile is coloured yellow.

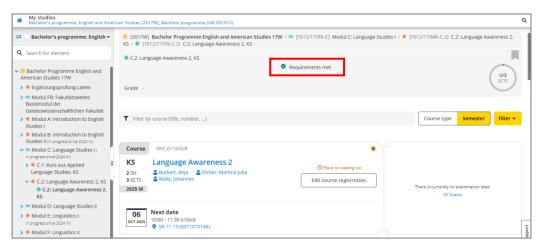

The link "Requirements" (2) takes you to the page "Requirement Status", where you can see which requirements you still need to fulfill and which you have already fulfilled.



If all requirements are met, only the text "Requirements met" is displayed instead of a link.

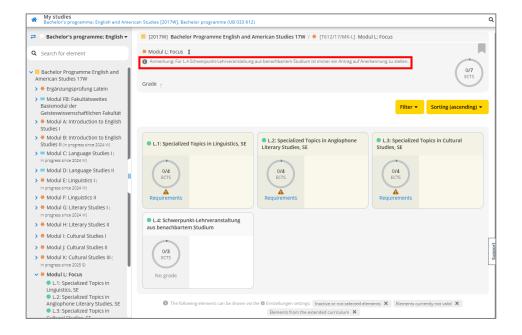


6.5. Notes

In some cases, you will also find explanatory notes in the elements, which indicate, for example, how individual modules must be completed according to the curriculum.

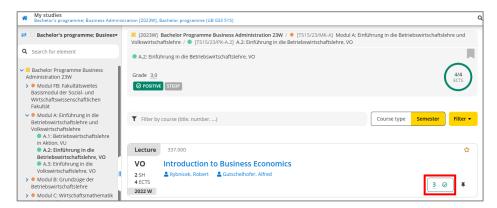
This often helpful information can only be found in UNIGRAZonline and in "My Degree Programme".

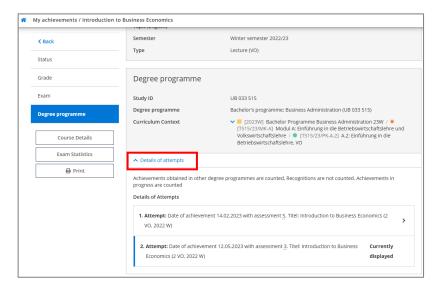
6.6. Course and examination attempts

If you want to see the number of attempts for a course or examination, open the relevant examination node and click on the valid achievement.



Scroll to the bottom of the overview window and click on "Details of attempts".

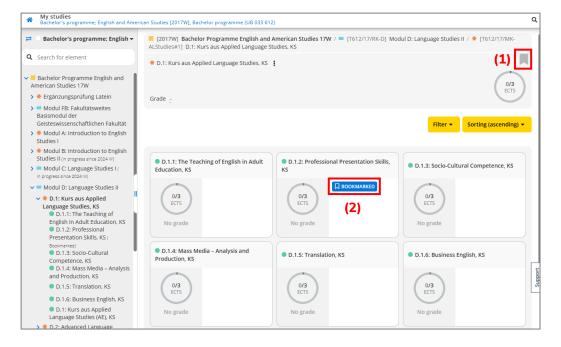


Alternatively, you can also access the course and examination attempts via the "My achievements" application.

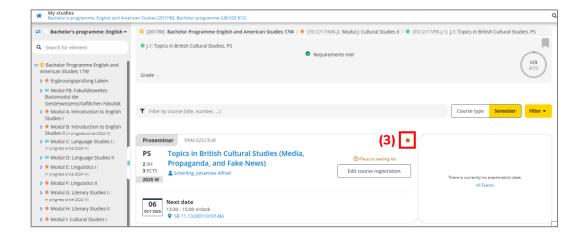
6.7. Bookmarking options

You can use the **bookmark icon** (1) to **mark** elements (modules, examination nodes, etc.) for **planning**. The element is then given the tag "Bookmarked" (2) (see also chapter 2.5).

You can use the **favourites icon** (3) to **bookmark courses**, which are then displayed in the "My bookmarked courses" application.

Filter, sorting and search options

Various filter, sorting and search options are available in "My Degree Programme". The filter and sorting buttons below are located below the study progress display.



7. Filter

You can use the filter button to customise the display in the courses and examinations area according to various criteria.

Courses:

- Registered for the course
- Course open for registration

Examinations:

- Registered for the exam
- Exam open for registration
- Exam registration possible in future

Only the elements that match your filter criteria will be displayed in the tile and page navigation.

Note: The filter has an effect across the levels. For example, if you select "Registered for the course", only the courses for which you have registered will be displayed at the lowest level.

Activated filters appear below the filter and sorting button and can be deleted again by clicking on the "x" without having to open the filter menu again.

8. Sorting

You can customise the sorting of the display in the tile menu or in the sidebar:

- Sorting (ascending / descending) = Sorting according to the order of the elements specified in the curriculum
- Name (ascending / descending) = Alphabetical sorting

Note: Changes to the sorting affect both the tile menu and the navigation in the sidebar.

The sorting can also be adjusted using the arrow button at the bottom of the sidebar. It works in the same way as the sort button.

9. Filter courses by course type or semester

At the level of examination elements (courses and examinations), you have the option of filtering by various terms (title, course number, year, etc.) and sorting by course type and semester.



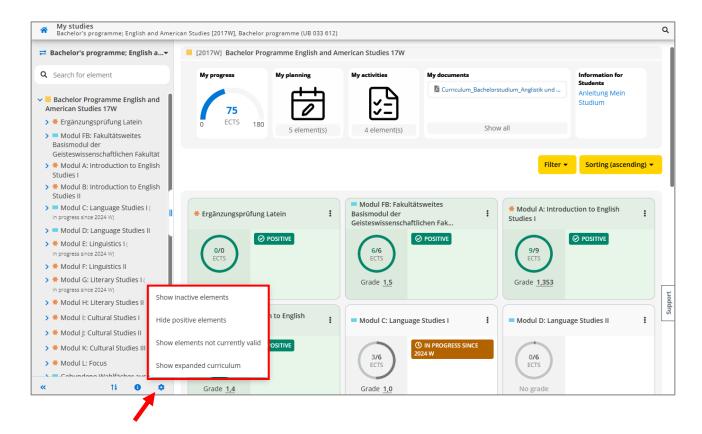
10. Show and hide options

In some cases, individual module or examination nodes may not be displayed. There may be various reasons for this.

- **Inactive elements:** Active nodes in the study structure become inactive nodes if, for example, the required number of elective modules have been selected in an elective area or modules in the required ECTS credit scope have been selected (unselected elements).
- Positive elements: positively completed elements
- **Elements not currently valid:** If modules can only be completed up to a certain semester, a time validity is entered (e.g. valid until 24W). Once this validity has expired, these modules are hidden and highlighted in grey.
- **Expanded curriculum:** This includes elements that are hidden (e.g. free elective 1, etc.). These only become visible when a positive achievement is assigned.

These elements are then not (or no longer) visible in the standard view in "My Degree Programme", but can be shown. You can use the **gear icon** at the bottom of the sidebar to customise the display of your degree programme. Click on the icon to open the corresponding selection menu and customise the display of the study structure by clicking on the desired option.

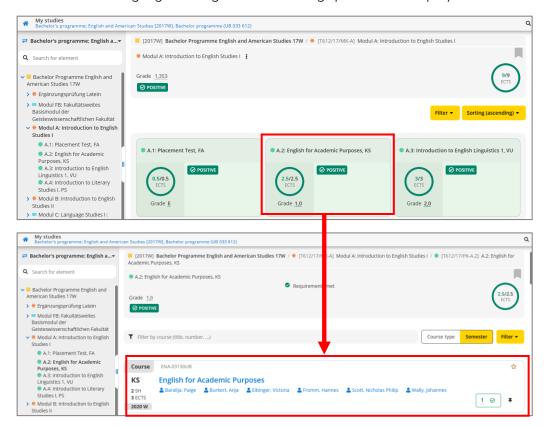
Use of achievements

In principle, all credits earned for your degree programme must be allocated to the nodes of your study plan so that UNIGRAZonline can correctly recognise and calculate your academic success.

Compulsory subjects for which you have no choice regarding the use of the course or examination are automatically allocated by the system as soon as the examination result or recognition has been approved by the department or institute.

11. Display of already allocated achievements

If a positive achievement has been allocated, this is displayed in the tile of the respective examination node. The tile is highlighted in green and the tag "positive" is displayed.



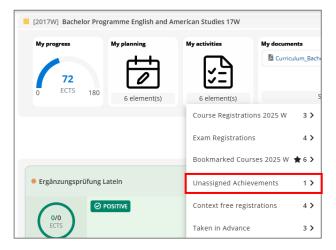
12. Reallocating unallocated achievements

Note: For modules with a selection rule (selection checkbox), the module must first be selected (see chapter 5.4). Only then is it possible to allocate unallocated achievements yourself. Otherwise, an error message will be displayed ("Transfer failed (reference id: xxx)").

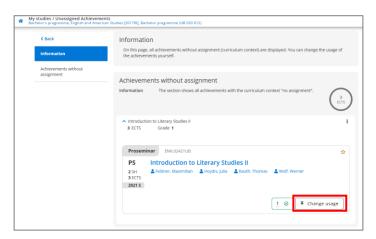

12.1. Option 1: Allocation via the "My activities" widget (recommended)

In the "My activities" widget, the achievements that you can assign yourself are displayed under "Unassigned Achievements". The page is only displayed if there are achievements with the curriculum context "no assignment".

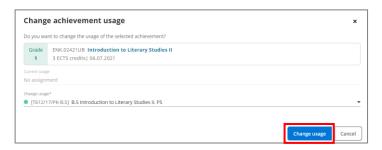


Select the relevant achievement (expand with the arrow icon) and click on the "Change usage" pin button.



In the dialogue window, you can select the curriculum context to which the achievement should be allocated. If there is a clear assignment in your degree programme, the context is already preselected. For achievements that can be allocated to several modules (optional), you can select the respective curriculum context in the drop-down menu.

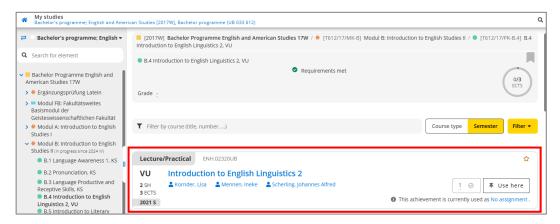
To reallocate the achievement, click on the "Change usage" button.

12.2. Option 2: Allocation via the tiles

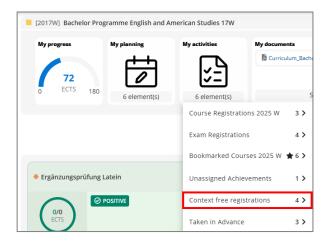
Achievements can also be allocated directly in the **target context**, i.e. at the examination node. Navigate to the examination node in the tile menu. The list of courses and examinations allocated to this examination node opens. If an achievement is currently allocated to another examination element in different module, but could also be allocated to this examination element, it will be displayed at the top of the list. You can recognise an inactive, positive achievement by the greyed-out button containing the grade and the positive tick icon. The **"Use here"** pin button to the right indicates that the achievement can be allocated to the currently selected context. If you click on "Use here", the "Change achievement usage" dialogue window opens. You can now allocate the achievement (see chapter 12.1).



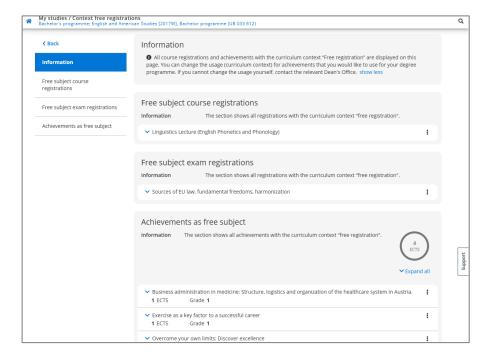
If a course is assigned to several modules in a degree programme (options), you can change the allocation yourself. To do this, click on the desired target node (as described above) and change the allocation.

13. Free registrations

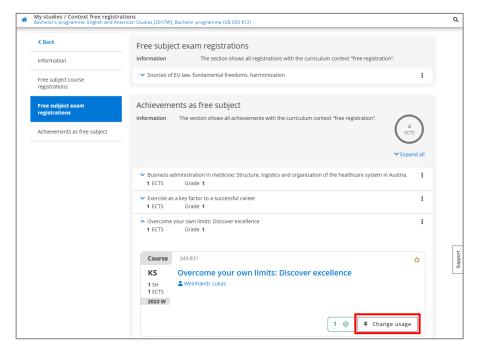
In the "My activities" widget, the elements that have the curriculum context "Free registration" (course registrations, exam registrations, positive achievements) are displayed under "Context free registrations".

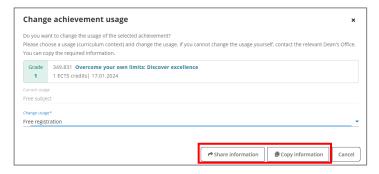


Select the respective achievement under "Achievements as free subject" (expand with the arrow icon) and click on the "Change usage" pin button.

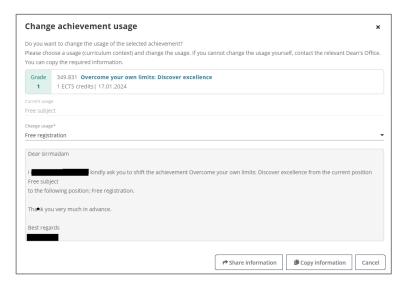


If you **cannot allocate** the achievement **yourself** (e.g. allocation as a free elective), the "Share information" and "Copy information" buttons are displayed in the dialogue window. In this case, you must contact the relevant dean's office.

By clicking on the "Copy information" button, a text is copied to the clipboard, which can be pasted directly into an email, for example. If the share function is available (depending on the device settings), the information can also be shared directly.



In the following cases, you **cannot** allocate achievements **yourself** in "My Degree Programme":

- Achievements that are not part of the selected curriculum. These can only be allocated via recognition. This may also apply to equivalent courses if, for example, you have switched to a newer curriculum.
- Courses that are part of the curriculum but were completed in another degree programme must also be recognised. Otherwise, no allocation is possible.
- You may not reallocate achievements that have already been recognised for a specific node in the curriculum.
- Free electives (except for recommended courses in the curriculum)
- Achievements,
 - o whose requirements are not met
 - o that have fewer ECTS credits than required in the curriculum
 - o or an option is no longer available because you have already made other selections.
- In general, you cannot allocate achievements if the "data" of "My Degree Programme" is currently being recalculated. The recalculation is triggered by changes to your achievements (e.g., new grade), your use of achievements (e.g., recognition) or changes to your curriculum by the administration (e.g., new courses are added to the curriculum). A corresponding

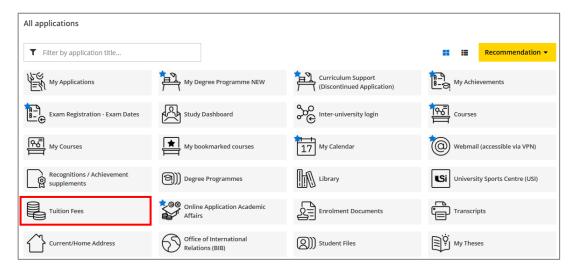

system message will inform you that you must wait for the recalculation, which in rare exceptional cases may even take several hours.

Click on "Registration status" in the window to get an overview of how many fee-free semesters are still available in each of your enrolled degree programmes.
