ABOUT THE PROJECT

VISION | AIM

The me_HeLi-D project aims to directly enhance mental health and mental health literacy, and more indirectly, to promote diversity-awareness among students. For this purpose, the aim is to develop and evaluate an evidence-based, effective, target group-specific, diversity-sensitive and freely available digital tool for students (aged 12-15 years) that supports their personal resources, empowers them with regard to their mental health and enhances their mental health literacy.

APPROACH

In a participatory approach, together with the partner schools, a digital tool will be developed that is well-adapted to the needs of the target group and is suitable for promoting mental health in a playful and relatable way. In addition, development will follow the guideline of the Framework for Diversity-Sensitive Content (FDSC), which serves the diversity-sensitive realization of content and will be developed within the project. This is an innovative endeavor, as there are, to our knowledge, no such guidelines available for universal digital prevention and intervention programs.

PROJECT TEAM

An interdisciplinary approach is of great importance when trying to achieve the goals of the project. Therefore, the consortium, is composed of in-service teachers, clinical and health psychologists, and researchers in the fields of inclusive education, pedagogy, psychology, sociology, computer sciences and informatics.

SEPT 15-16, 2022 GRAZ | AUT

With the Kick-Off meeting on September 15 & 16, 2022, the international consortium registered a successful start of the 3-year Erasmus+ project. A hybrid setting ensured that all project parterns, including the associated partners, were able to come together to get the collaboration off to a good start. The goal of the meeting was to clarify responsibilities, project milestones, as well as schedule and budget management issues. Quality assurance, risk management, data, and publication plans were discussed and finalized. In addition, initial workshops and brainstorming activities were conducted on the program's topics resilience, mindfulness, help-seeking behavior, as well as prevention of anxiety and depression.







2ND PARTNER MEETING

MARCH 16-17, 2023 LJUBLJANA| SLO

From March 16-17, 2023, the second international me_HeLi-D project meeting with representatives from all partner institutions took place in Ljubljana, Slovenia. The meeting was hosted in a hybrid setting by the Educational Research Institute (ERI) in Slovenia. Important issues and steps for program design and content were discussed, elaborated and decided. In addition, the concept for the participatory workshops in the partner schools (AUT, SLO, POL) was discussed and adapted according to the valuable suggestions and contributions of the teachers of the partner schools. Upcoming tasks and milestones were covered, such as the implementation of the participatory workshops, the launch of the project website, content creation, design development and the final editing of the promotional materials.

UNIVERSITY of GRAZ

In addition to all necessary project management activities, the University of Graz was instrumental in producing the first project deliverables, namely the three literature reports on mental health literacy, mindfulness, resilience and help-seeking behavior (#1), prevention of anxiety and depression (#2), and diversity sensitive content (#3). The reports form the basis for the evidence-based content and design development of the program's modules. Furthermore, an initial concept for the upcoming participatory workshops was drafted for further discussion at the 2nd partner meeting. Finally, in collaboration with Sofia University, the ethical considerations for digital mental health were summarized to propose guidelines and frameworks for the me_HeLi-D project. The UNI-IT is currently setting up a test course in Moodle, that all project partners will have access to in order to share ideas for design and content.



ERI | Educational Research Institute

ERI oversees the module development work package. The first half-year of the project already led to systematic reviews of selected topics (i.e., resilience, mindfulness, and help-seeking). Furthermore, the evaluation team has selected and prepared (double-blind translations) the screening tool covering the aimed topics of future digital training. We are currently working on the concept and design of the training, which will be addressed with the students in the upcoming workshops, so their ideas and needs will be incorporated into the training tool. We are also trying to reach a wider audience, therefore we will present one of the first outputs of the project (a systematic literature review) at the ECER international conference. The news about the project for the national stakeholders is also available on the <u>partner website</u> and the <u>SLODRE website</u> (The Slovenian Educational Research Association).



UNIVERSITY of SILESIA

University of Silesia is responsible for the dissemination of the me_HeLi-D project. The activities successfully carried out so far in this area are as follows:

Currently, the team of the University of Silesia is working on the improvement of the website and the completion of the promomotional video.

SOFIA UNIVERSITY

Sofia University is the technical expert for digital realization and integration. In an initial step, tasks were allocated between the team members of the Bulgarian team: plugin integration, adaptive components of the user interface and the environment, technical aspects of data gathering, analysis, presentation, and legal specifics. Activities completed in the last six months include conducting an initial infrastructure check, a high level review of available plugins, and a preliminary introduction with the questionnaires to be used. For the purpose of the 2nd project meeting, an introduction to Moodle (Modular Object-Oriented Dynamic Learning Environment) was prepared, as the platform will be used for program implementation. As the project raises many ethics-related concerns, ethics of digital mental health were researched and prepared for the meeting, aiming in developing a common understanding between the team members and discussing principles and frameworks that will be used in the me HeLi-D project. Finally, legal considerations for digital mental health were prepared, to make sure the project is legally compliant. The aim of the presentation was to present the background, describe existing applicable regulations, propose procedures to be applied, and discuss the specifics for the me_HeLi-D project.
