
Application

Application

Application Documents

Upload all application documents to the **online** application platform as **PDF files**. Please note that all documents have to be either **in English** or accompanied by a certified English translation subject to verification.

- Curriculum vitae (CV)
- Motivation Statement
- Copy of passport (ID page with photograph)
- English language certificate
- Bachelor's diploma/certificate
- Transcript of records/Diploma Supplement
- Information about courses relevant for the application
- Grade Point Average (GPA) and information about the grading system used at your university
- 2 signed letters of recommendation
- Proof of professional experience of at least one year after completion of the Bachelor's degree (Leipzig)
