






Lignite (mining) in Germany







- LEAG: more then 8000 employees
- In total 13000 directly and indirectly affected by the coal phase out includes service providers or suppliers
- 22.5% of the energy used in Germany was generated from coal





30 years after German reunion

The consequences:

- Economic and social divide between East and West Germany
- No equivalence of living conditions
- Small economic structure in the east
- Lack of large industrial companies
- Less salary for equal work
- East Germans underrepresented in management positions (Kaune-Nüßlein & Scharenberg, 2019, p. 7)
