Tally sticks have been used for centuries as a means of accounting, as receipts and promissory notes, and even as a means of payment. But what do they reveal about writing, administration, and knowledge across different cultures and historical periods? This interdisciplinary workshop brings together experts from archaeology, ethnology, history, and Oriental Studies to discuss the diverse functions and development of tally sticks. Contributions will explore their significance at the intersection of written and non-written administration, offering new perspectives on the history of information storage.
