

**Prof Raymond F. Paloutzian, PhD,**

Prof Paloutzian received his doctoral degree from Claremont Graduate School in 1972.

He is Professor Emeritus of experimental and social psychology at Westmont College, and was consultant to the Religion, Experience, and Mind (REM) Lab Group at the University of California, Santa Barbara. He has been a Visiting Professor at Stanford University and the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven, Belgium. He is a Past-President of American Psychological Division (APA) Division on Psychology of Religion and Spirituality, and is a Fellow of five APA divisions including the Society for the Psychological Study of Social Issues, Society for the Psychological Study of Religion and Spirituality, and International/Global Psychology.

He is also Fellow of the Western Psychological Association and the Association for Psychological Science. For 18 years he was Editor-in-Chief of *The International Journal for the Psychology of Religion*. He wrote *Invitation to the Psychology of Religion* (eds. 1, 2, and 3), and co-edited *Forgiveness and Reconciliation: Psychological Pathways to Conflict Transformation and Peace Building* (Springer, 2010), the *Handbook of the Psychology of Religion and Spirituality* (Guilford, 1<sup>st</sup> ed. 2005; 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2013), *Processes of Believing: The Acquisition, Maintenance, and Change in Credictions* (Springer, 2017), and *Assessing Spirituality in a Diverse World*(Springer, 2020).

He has given invited talks on “The Psychology of Religion in Global Perspective” in various countries around the world. For the past 10 years he has been in collaboration at the University of Graz on believing as a fluid and fundamental psychological process manifest as conscious or non-conscious meaning making.
