The General Assembly of the International Society for Eighteenth Century Studies (ISECS), held on the occasion of the XVth Congress in Edinburgh, decided to agree the application of SOG18 to get a full member. Conference Information

- The Humanistic Forum (Ljubljana) has organized a conference in Pécs (Hungary) with the title **“Europe - East of West. 30 years transitions – quo vadis?”** at 28th-30th of September. The SOG18 was one of the partners because a part of the actual problems may be explained with the 18th century contexts.
- The Department of History at the University of Novi Sad is organizing an international conference in Novi Sad (Serbia) at 23th-25th of October under the title **“The Rise to a Province. The relation change between the statal whole and the small regions in the middle Danube basin”**. The SOG18 is a cooperation partner, and several SOG18 members will present their papers. After the conference it will be opened the Serbian version of the exhibition *“We and Požarevac. 300 years impact on Europe”* (after having been in Požarevac and Vršac). The Turkish version was opened in April in Istanbul (Turkey), the Romanian version was opened at the end of June in Timișoara (Romania).
- The next SOG18 conference is going to be prepared. It will be held at 27th-29th of May 2021 in Graz under the title **“City and Future: Europe and its South East in the long 18th century”** on the occasion of the status of Novi Sad and Timișoara as European Capital Cities. This conference will be organized as cooperation project with the Austrian, the Hungarian and the Slovenian Society for 18th Century Studies.
