



25th Annual Conference on European Tort Law

April 8 to 10, 2026 | Vienna

Essential information on court practice and legislation in the area of tort law in 2025. Including a Special Session on 'Harmonisation of Tort Law Revisited'.





The Annual Conference, which celebrates its 25th anniversary in 2026, provides a unique opportunity for both practitioners and academics to discover the most significant tort law developments from across Europe in 2025. Experts from each of the many jurisdictions represented discuss selected highlights from their contributions to the European Tort Law Yearbook, an annual volume which provides a comprehensive overview of legislative and judicial developments in tort law throughout Europe during the preceding year. The Yearbook 'European Tort Law 2025' will be published in autumn 2026. The national reports are followed by an overview of EU law developments and a comparative, concluding summary, which critically assesses the most important trends and issues to emerge.

A Special Session on Friday will revisit the issue of harmonisation of tort law, exploring the contemporary relevance of efforts to achieve greater coherence among the tort law systems in Europe and what lessons the developments during the first quarter of the 21st century may offer in this respect. Bjarte Askeland will address the topic of harmonisation within court practice, Marta Infantino's presentation will cover tort law reforms and European statutory laws, and Paula Giliker will reflect on EU intervention into the law of tort and the extent to which it acts as a force for the harmonisation of European tort law.

Two additional events have been scheduled for the anniversary Conference. The Conference will commence on the evening of Wednesday, April 8, with an opening lecture by Helmut Koziol on 'Rethinking the Law of Loss Allocation', and will conclude with an Early Career Panel, offering emerging scholars and early career academics the opportunity to present their work at the Conference.
