Two or three student research assistants in Philosophy (Theories of Justice and Ethics) in the Research Project "Historical Injustice - The Consequences to Justice of Changed Circumstances"

(10 or 20 hours a week; fixed-term employment for the period of one or two year; positions to be filled preferably starting October 2nd 2017 in Graz, Austria)

The project (funded by the Austrian Science Foundation) investigates the normative consequences of past injustices. The project's main question is: Should justice have a forward-looking orientation, backward-looking orientation, or something in between, and what are reasons to re-evaluate the orientation with respect to how we ought to respond to the consequences of historical injustices? The project aims to develop an integrated approach that would include prospective distributive elements (the focus on the needs of present day individuals), historical entitlement elements (the validity of past claims and their presumed continuation), and structural injustice elements (such as how social structures might disadvantage certain groups beyond distributive injustices).

The student research assistants will support the praedocs, postdoc, and project leader by researching literature, compiling a database of works on historical injustice and empirical research findings on the cases, formatting papers for publication and the planned edited volume(s) and/or special issue(s), organizing the international workshop and conference, establishing the internet platform of the project, and, continually documenting the work done by team members on the public project website.

Applicants must be enrolled in a philosophy, history, law, cultural anthropology, Jewish studies or social science study programme (a the level of BA or preferably MA or equivalent) at the University of Graz. Good knowledge in English (at level C1 or higher) is expected.

The applications have to contain the following documents in pdf format:

- a motivation letter.
- an abstract in English of the BA or master thesis in preparation
- a Curriculum Vitae including information on previous work experience, evidence for knowledge in English
- transcript of records
- two references

The selection procedure will commence immediately after the application deadline, with interviews to be expected in August. All communication, including interviews, will be conducted in English.
