We would like to use the Austrian Linguistics Conference to get a good overview of current research projects on monolingual and multilingual language development in Austria and neighboring countries as well as for further networking opportunities, especially those of an interdisciplinary nature. Therefore, we cordially invite you to submit presentation abstracts on different topics on language development from a psycholinguistic perspective:

- monolingual and multilingual L1 and L2 development across the lifespan
- typical and atypical developmental trajectories across the lifespan
- oral, signed and written language development

We welcome a variety of theories and methods: diverse theoretical backgrounds and directions in language development research should shed light on different facets of this complex topic. Experimentally oriented contributions are welcome as well as all kinds of semi-structured investigations and those using spontaneous speech.

The slots for presentations are 30 minutes long (20 minutes presentation in German or English + 10 minutes discussion).

if needed additionally Saturday, 09/12/2023 afternoon
