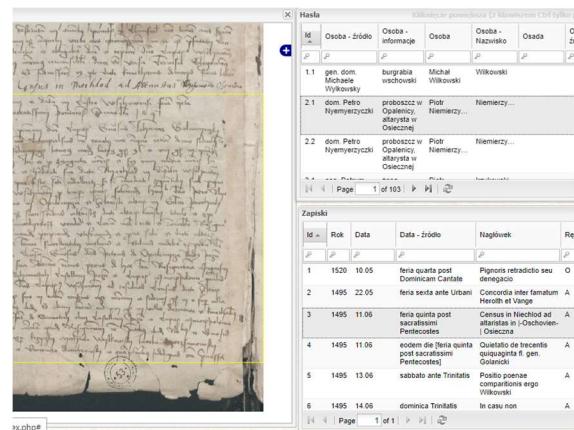

Application of the DARIAH-PL infrastructure in historical research

The goal of creating a digital research infrastructure within the DARIAH-PL project involves the preparation of tools which can be utilized not only by digital humanists, but also by a less specialized audience. The Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences is working within the consortium to adapt these tools for the needs of historical research. The project aims to establish infrastructure which would support all research process from sourcing, through data acquisition, enrichment, binding and analysis to visualisation of the results. Work focusses on tools for building digital repositories, subject-specific dictionaries and ontologies as well as reference databases. An important part of the project is automatic extraction of the data from the text.



The presentation will introduce the work of DARIAH-PL and describe how its results can be used in historical research. Especially, to facilitate developing databases based on text, creating digital source editions and harmonisation of the data from different projects.



Adam Zapala - PhD in history (Jagiellonian University in Cracow). Currently he works as PI of the DARIAH-PL project at the Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences. Research interests include: the history of contacts between Poles and the Holy See in the second half of the 15th century & the use of digital tools in historical research.
