THE LECTURES

The ark narrative is one of the literary gems of the Old Testament. What its exact message is, however, is not clear, and therefore it is intensely debated in literature. New archaeological research at two sites mentioned in the Ark Narrative allows us to see this story in a different perspective, which will be presented.



The cult in the Kingdom of Judah in the early phases of Iron Age II represents a complex subject that we know about from material

culture and from biblical texts. These two sources of 'evidence' are often in remarkable tension with each other. One site that provides new insights and possible solutions to some interpretive crossroads is Tel Moza, the site of the recently discovered unknown temple.
