Models of martyrial sanctity: The Child Martyr and his Mother in Prudentius' Peristephanon 10

Freitag, 1.12.2017, 10:00-11:30, SR 47.11/UZT

Abstract:

Among the martyrial texts, special attention is to be paid to the hymn 10 of Prudentius' *Peristephanon*, which tells in 1140 iambic trimeters the gestures of the martyr Romanus from the East. The lecture aims to analyze the representation both of the child that is martyrized together with Romanus, and of the child's mother, emphasizing, on the one hand, the principle that God has made all the ages *capaces virtutum*, that is, even children are able to achieve the triumph of martyrdom, on the other hand, the maternal contribution to the realization of this ideal of holiness.

Vita Isabella D'Auria:

Isabella D'Auria is doctor of Philosophy in Classical, Christian, Medieval-Humanistic, Greek and Latin Philology from the Department of Humanities of the University of Naples Federico II. She is currently "cultore della materia" at the Chair of Ancient Christian Literature of the same university.

She has participated as research fellow in the FIRB Project 2012 "The Construction of Space and Time in the Transmission of Collective Identities. Religious Cohabitations and/or Polarizations in the Ancient World (Ist-VIth cent. CE)", and in the National research project (PRIN 2009) I cristiani e gli altri. Forme letterarie del dibattito religioso tra III e VI secolo (2012/2013). Her main research focus are the Ancient Christian poetry and the Hagiographic literature of the IV-VI centuries. She has published a monograph regarding the paraphrastic poem, titled Alethia, of Claudius Marius Victorius.
