In September 2013 the CEC and the theological Faculty of Graz will host to the fourth Consultation of the Graz Process. This Consultation is intended to be a platform for discussing theological, cultural, scientifical and juridical aspects. Considering the current European and global situation, it aims to contribute to give orientation regarding the current economical crisis in Europe and around the globe.

H. E. Metropolit Emmanuel of France, will participate as President of the CEC and as director of the liaison office of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople in Brussels. Also the General Secretary of the CEC, Dr. Guy Liagre/Genf will participate in this consultation.

On Thursday, 26th of September 2013 an official event is going to open the fourth Consultation of the Theological Faculties in Europe. This event will take place in the assembly hall of the Karl-Franzens University of Graz.

TASKS OF THE GRAZ PROCESS

- In accordance with the commitments of the Charta Oecumenica, the Graz Process promotes "ecumenical openness and cooperation in Christian education, and in theological training, continuing education and research." (II, 3)
- Discourse on the current situation within the individual churches, faculties and countries
- Promotion of the ecumenical reception process
- Discussion of possible cooperations (exchange between instructors, students, grants and on studies)
- Creation and updating of a knowledge pool on the topics mentioned above
- Organization of regular consultations organized by the Conference of European Churches (CEC) and the Faculty of Catholic Theology at Graz University
- In terms of a long-term perspective, establishing a permanent Conference of faculties and Universities in Europe which are involved in theological education.
