



Call for Applications Academic Year 2020/2021: Research Exchange

The **ARQUS European University Alliance** is a cooperation between the Universities of Bergen, Granada, Graz, Leipzig, Lyon¹, Padua, and Vilnius, which is funded by the European Commission.

Among other activities, ARQUS will support **research stays at one of the ARQUS partner universities** by funding travel expenses and providing opportunities for further intensified cooperation with the host university.

In the context of **doctoral training**, this mobility programme can also be used for initiating collaboration with a doctoral co-advisor from one of the ARQUS partner universities.

The planned research stay has a minimum duration of two weeks and a maximum duration of three months depending on the funding category. Eligible for research exchanges are professors, senior researchers, postdocs, doctoral candidates, and advanced master students from all faculties and fields of research.

Funding categories:

- Category 1: Senior Researchers²: 2 to 4 weeks, funding (on a pro rata basis): 1500€ per month
- Category 2: Doctoral Candidates and Master Students: 2 weeks to 3 months, funding (on a pro rata basis): 1200€ per month

Application deadline: 16 October 2020

Funding period: The research stay must be carried out until 30 September 2022.

² The minimum funding amount for Senior Researchers/Post-Docs is 750€ (= 2 working weeks) and the maximum funding amount is 1,500€ (= 4 working weeks). Stays of between 2 and 4 working weeks are calculated on a diem aliquot basis.
