# <u>SEL for SDGs: Why social and emotional learning (SEL) is necessary to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)</u>

We would like to share with you relevant reading material that connects *social and emotional learning (SEL) with achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)*. The authors begin the article describing the conflicting goals of the SDGs and how the attainment of these goals may necessitate a balancing act as well as the 'dissonance and the SDGs' at the level of individual and social collectives because of the conflicting nature of the SDGs. Finally, the authors posit two specific avenues, emotional resilience and prosocial behaviour, for managing dissonance and attainment of the SDGs and describe the need for social and emotional learning as fundamental skills in our education systems to achieve the SDGs. #### Student immigration, migration, and teacher preparation

If you are interested in the topic of multicultural education, a new study has been published that reviews the *evolution of multicultural education* as a framework for addressing the education of immigrant students and examines the current extent to which teachers feel prepared for and are attentive to culturally responsive practices. #### Teachers' and students - compassionate love and educational inequality

An interesting approach to the positive effects of teacher-student relationships (TSR) has been taken in the study exploring the *effect of a teachers' compassionate love* as a possible determinant of TSR. The connection between teachers' perceived social support from co-workers and the closeness dimension of TSR appeared fully mediated by both dimensions of teachers' compassionate love. Another interesting review addresses the recent advances linking the teachers' attitudes, perceptions, and beliefs to inequality in students' outcomes. The review has identified specific *aspects of teacher psychology that contribute to disparities in students' outcomes* as well as the mechanisms underlying these effects. #### How can socio-emotional competencies and diversity awareness be measured?

Socio-emotional competencies and diversity awareness (SEDA competencies) are not as easily accessible to measurement as, for example, reading or math competencies. However, the importance of SEDA competencies and their promotion in schools is increasingly recognized. Having that in mind, the project partners from the Leibniz Institute for Research and Information in Education, <u>DIPF</u> will present different ways to measure these competencies reliably and validly and discuss the challenges associated with the different techniques.

This annual scientific event brings together experts in the field of teacher education and junior researchers from all over the world and is a great opportunity to discuss and reflect on different aspects of policy and practice in teacher education.
