Programme Outline (Specialisation fields)

Development Economics

You will explore models from development economics such as "big push" theories and the role of the state in development.

Applied Environmental Economics

You will explore advanced methods and models of environmental and resource economics.

Industrial Economics

You will explore static models of imperfect competition in price and quantity determination and models of price discrimination.

What is a Double Degree Programme?

- A programme developed and offered jointly by several higher education institutions.
- It offers students to specialise in complementary focus areas at the participating universities.
- Students profit from a wide range of specialisation options and from a unique intercultural experience.
- A double degree is one academic degree awarded by both universities.

Students of this Double Degree Programme must earn at least 60 ECTS at their entrance university. At least 30 ECTS must be completed at the partner university.
