A Joint Programme is a programme developed, implemented and offered jointly by several higher education institutions. Upon successful completion, graduates receive a jointly conferred degree, recognized by all partner universities.

Students choose a university as their entrance university where they start and complete the programme.

It is required to complete at least 30 ECTS under the responsibility of a partner university. Physical and virtual mobility is possible and can also be combined

The choosing of the entrance university as well as a mobility university have an integral impact regarding the individual specialisation

Mobility & Virtual Exchange

The Arqus Joint Master's Programme European Studies features virtual exchange components to the extent of 30 ECTS. Within 5 modules (1-4 & 7) a joint online course of 5 ECTS each has to be completed by all students. A joint online colloquium complements the master's thesis.

You can spend a physical mobility at one of the partner universities in the second and/or third semester, depending on your interests and the specialisation and regional focus offered.
