

Guidelines for authors (Extract)

1. Contributions to all fields of law and its related areas can be submitted.
2. The contribution should be scientifically founded, original and include new scientific findings. The contribution must not have been previously published.
3. The contribution must be prepared in accordance with the general principles of good scientific practice. Possible conflicts of interest (eg. external commissioning, performance of an expert opinion, result of a research project) must be disclosed.
4. Manuscripts in German or English language are published.
5. If the contribution is accepted, it is released under the CC-BY license. The author grants the editors the exclusive right of first publication with submission of the paper. The authors are allowed to conclude additional contracts for the non-exclusive distribution of the version of their work published in the ALJ with a mention of the first publication in this journal (eg. by publishing in collecting publications or a book).
6. For the submission of the article one-time registration and uploading of the text are sufficient.

Our Concept

With the newly established journal „Austrian Law Journal – “Open Access Review of Developments in Austrian, European and International Law“ a publication medium has been established, representing a new publication culture in the field of law.

The ALJ is edited by three members of the Faculty of Law from the University of Graz and ten other legal academics from all faculties of law in Austria.

One of the innovative aspects of the Journal rests in the fact that all main scientific articles go through a double-blind peer-review process before publication and are thus subject to an optimal system of quality assurance.

The ALJ addresses itself to legal academics from all disciplines of law as well as to practitioners interested in legal research. The ALJ follows a broad concept and covers all areas of law.



Peer-Review-Process

Quality management should come from the law for the law. Therefore, all main scientific articles are subject to a double-blind peer-review process prior to publication.

Based on the recommendation of the reviewer and the assessment of the editorial board member of the respective discipline, the editors decide on the publication of the article.

Neither author nor reviewer are aware of the identity of the other person. The author has the possibility to exclude a maximum of three reviewers from the peer-review-process.

Open-Access

The ALJ is an open-access journal, ie. scientific articles can be accessed freely and without charge. We are firmly convinced that the free public availability of legal research is a valuable contribution to the worldwide exchange of knowledge.
