### **OBJECTIVES**

The two day workshop aims to bring together talented young academics and professors from different universities and disciplines to discuss about their PhD projects related to human rights, democracy, diversity and gender. The workshop will give selected participants the opportunity to present and discuss their research with an international audience in a seminar format, receive qualified feedback and gain thereby enhanced presentation skills. The workshop shall be a forum to exchange experiences on the PhD process, address methodological questions and discuss research projects at the highest level.

The workshop is intended to facilitate a network of young scholars from different countries by providing them opportunities to interact and share experiences with fellow scholars from various disciplines.

### **FORMAT**

Participants will present either their overall PhD projects or specific chapters they are currently working on. Each presentation shall not exceed 20 minutes and will be followed by 30 minutes of discussion.

### **CONDITIONS**

The PhD projects and research topic should be related to human rights, democracy, diversity or gender. Due to the interdisciplinary character of the workshop participants of all academic backgrounds will be accepted. The knowledge of English is essential.

### **APPLICATION**

The deadline for the receipt of applications is the 31<sup>st</sup> May 2015.
