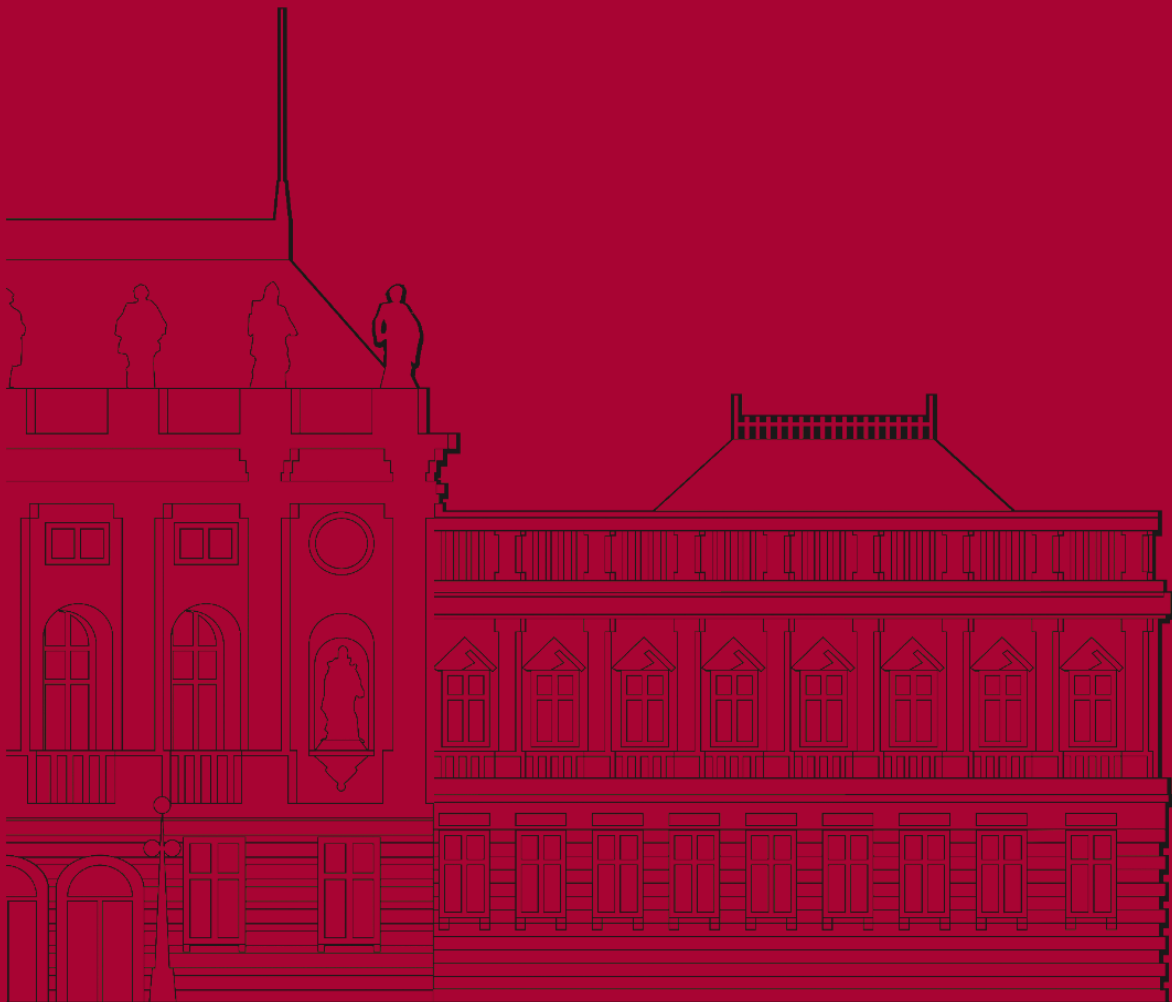

Data Protection Declaration „Graz Law Working Paper Series“

The University of Graz takes data protection very seriously and will treat your personal data confidentially and in accordance with the legal requirements. This Data Protection Declaration is designed to inform you, as an author of a paper, in accordance with Articles 12 and 13 General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), about how and why we will process your personal data, the legal basis for this, and about your rights regarding this data processing by the Graz Law Working Paper Series.

Purpose and legal basis of data processing:

We process your personal data for the purpose of enabling the publication process from submission to review and final publication of a paper within the framework of the Graz Law Working Paper Series.

The purpose of recording the data mentioned below is to fulfill a contract with you or for the implementation of pre-contractual measures. The legal basis for this processing is Article 6 para 1 lit b GDPR.

Collected data:

For the administration and publication of the papers, we will process the following personal data:

- Salutation
- First name
- Last Name
- Organizational affiliation
- Email address
- Post address
- Telephone number
- Paper title
- Paper content

Duration of storage:

In conjunction with the License Agreement your data will be stored perpetual.

Transmission of your personal data:

Your data will be processed within the University of Graz.

With the publication of the paper, the data will also be transmitted to Social Science Research Network (SSRN). The paper will be published on the SSRN homepage. Information about their latest “Privacy Policy” can be found under <https://www.elsevier.com/legal/privacy-policy>.

Your rights:

Where the processing of your personal data is concerned, you have the following rights at all times with regard to the University of Graz, Faculty of Law:

- the right of access to the personal data in question (Article 15, GDPR),
- the right to rectification (Article 16, GDPR) or erasure (Article 17, GDPR) or restriction of processing (Article 18, GDPR),
- the right to data portability (Article 20, GDPR),
- the right to object (Article 21, GDPR),
- the right to withdraw consent (Article 7 para 3, GDPR) which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal,

You also have the

- right to lodge a complaint (Article 77, GDPR),
