Prof. Dr. FANG Xiaomin is full Professor at the Law School of Nanjing University in PR China and adjunct Professor at University Goettingen in Germany. She is director of the German-Sino Institute of Legal Studies at Nanjing University and co-director of the German-Sino Institute of Legal Studies at Goettingen University. She received her Doctor juris from Goettingen University in 2002, Master of Law from Nanjing University in 1995 and from Goettingen University in 1994, bachelor's degree of Law from Nanjing University in 1991. She was visiting professor in Bucerius Law School (Hamburg), Max-Planck Institute for Competition and Innovation (Munich), at Bristol University (UK), Bonn University, Free University Berlin, New York University etc. Her research interests concentrate on competition law, regulation law and international trade law. She teaches courses on economic law, competition law, comparative law and European law. She is member of China Association for Economic Law, and member of Board of Chinese Association of European legal Studies. She published books and papers in Chinese, German and English about economic law as well as competition law and policy. Her recent books are *Competition Law* (China Renmin University Press, Beijing, 2009) and *European Legal Harmony and Europeanization of Law in EU Member state: An example analysis of Competition Law* (Encyclopedia of Chinese Publishing House, Beijing, 2010). She is chef editor of the Journal "Sino-German Law Forum". She attended a series of meetings related to antimonopoly legislation and implementation since 2002 hold by Chinese MOFCOM and Legal Affairs Office of the Standing Committee of National People's Congress, has provided consultancy works on core institutions of the China's Antimonopoly Law. She spoke at many international law events – including events at the National Seoul University, Waseda University, Goettingen University, Freiburg University, Wuerzburg University, National Taipei University, Max-Planck Institute of foreign and international private Law in Hamburg, Koeln University, Chinese Academy of Social Science, UNCTAD, ASCOLA and Asia Competition Forum etc.
