Guidelines for paper preparation

- *Length of the manuscript: approx. 6000 words, references included.
- *Language: All text written in English (British spelling). In case you are not primarily writing in English, please make sure to have your paper reviewed by a native speaker before submitting.
- *The manuscript must be an unpublished text, based on original material.
- *The manuscript must be prepared following the **Publication Manual** of the <u>American Psychological Association</u>, 7th Edition. See also: https://apastyle.apa.org
- *All manuscripts must include an **abstract** containing a maximum of 300 words typed on a separate page.
- *After the abstract, please supply up to **five keywords** or brief phrases.
- *All manuscripts must contain the **essential elements needed** to convey your paper: Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results (in case of empirical work), Conclusions, Artwork and Tables with captions.
- *There are no strict formatting requirements, but, please
- submit articles formatted as Microsoft Word files (no PDF!)
- be as simple and thrifty as possible as concerns the formats of titles, sub-titles and subheadings
- avoid subheadings, such as "1.1.2.4" or any other sophisticated form of subchapters, subparts etc.
- do not set entire pages as boxes,
- avoid footnotes (or be at least as thrifty as possible with footnotes), include all citations and annotations in the text proper,
- give each table, figure or image a caption, describing accurately what it depicts. Include the caption in the text file, close to the citation, not in the file of the table, figure or image.
- *If your article includes any Videos and/or other Supplementary material, this should be included in your initial submission.
- Supply all supplementary material in standard file formats.
- Photos or drawings with fine shading should be saved as TIFF with a minimum resolution of 300dpi.

CV: If you wish your CV to be amended or changed, compared to the one we have from The Graz Conference 2020, please provide a short bio of 300 words maximum.

References

As a rule, all the references given in the list of references should be cited in the body of the text (i.e. in the text proper, any appendix, figure legends, or tables).

Cite the references in the text following the APA-rules.

Write the list of references, including all work published on the internet, at the end of the paper in alphabetic order, following the reference list style of the APA.

Permissions

- *If excerpts from copyrighted works (including websites), such as photos, illustrations, tables, animations, videos, or text quotations are included in the manuscript, it is the author's responsibility to obtain permission from the copyright holder (and where required also from recognizable persons in photos) for both the print and online format, unless they can be used without permission under a copyright exception.
- *Please require "nonexclusive world rights in all languages for all media and all editions of copyrighted works, including advertising, publicity, and promotional materials", comply with the instructions stipulated in the permission(s) concerning acknowledgments or credit lines within your manuscript (e.g., reference to the copyright holder in captions) and (!) keep the written confirmation of the permission in your possession with the copy of your manuscript.
- *Please be aware that we will not be able to refund any costs that may have been incurred in receiving these permissions. As an alternative, material from other sources should be used.

Links to Web Pages

Under current law, there is a risk that the author and the publisher will be held liable if a web page to which there is a link in the author's work contains content that infringes copyright (e.g., images or texts for which the rights were not clarified in a proper manner). In order to reduce this risk, the following measures should be taken if you include links in your work:

- Please only link to trustworthy websites (e.g., websites of renowned publishers, scientific societies, well-known companies and associations, Springer Nature websites).
